FROM THE GOOD SCHOOLS GUIDE 2023

HEADMISTRESS

"[Sarah Segrave] has a BA in education and history from Durham University and an MA from the UCL Institute of Education. A founding member of staff, having joined as a history and Latin teacher when the school opened in 1993 [...] She says it has been 'fascinating' to be there for the entire evolution of the school and feels like 'the guardian of that school spirit' as she watches new generations of boys come to the same school that their dads went to."

"Despite spending her entire career on the same site, she is outward-looking. Parents are impressed by her and say staff are 'very loyal' to her."

EXIT SCHOOLS

"A handful of boys leave at 11+, the rest at 13+, with around half going to day schools, half to boarding. In 2022, boys headed to 25 different schools. Most popular destinations over the last decade or so include Dulwich College, Eton College, Tonbridge School, Westminster and Radley College. Charterhouse, Harrow, St Paul's, King's College School, Wimbledon and Winchester College also feature."

ACADEMICS OVERVIEW

"Teaching quality is 'a real strength of the school', according to parents, and there are 'a large number of exceptional teachers'. There is a 'fairly traditional ethos,' say parents but 'modern in terms of learning'. Parents praise the 'inclusivity' of the approach, with less able pushed to do their best and play to their strengths as well as the more able."

"The head stresses the importance of high-level teaching in humanities, languages and science, ensuring they are not crowded out of the curriculum by the emphasis on English and maths. 'There is always something that challenges us in lessons,' one boy told us, while parents say that 'expectations are high'."

"A warm, welcoming, inclusive school with a traditional style that focuses its energies on its pupils' academic progress, personal development and wellbeing rather than on being super slick. It's an approach that enables them to access leading boarding and day schools in the country."
