1	Where is the deposit that I paid upon admission to Eaton House Schools?	During the admission process you would have paid a deposit of £4,395 to secure the pupil's place at the school. The deposit is held by the school throughout the pupil's time here and is returned shortly after the end of their final term.
2	How do deposits work for siblings?	Pupils joining Eaton House with a sibling already attending the school will only need to pay a 'sibling deposit' of £1,000. If a pupil leaves Eaton House Schools but their sibling will continue attending then £3,395 of the full deposit will be transferred to 'top up' the sibling's deposit to a full deposit. The remaining £1,000 deposit for the departing pupil will then be returned as a credit against their final term extras with any remaining deposit balance being credited against their sibling's fees.
3	Is my child (aged 2) eligible for 15 hours free childcare?	<p>The '15 hours free childcare' early years funding for pupils aged two is not universal. Please use this link to check eligibility and apply:</p> <p>https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-childcare-if-youre-working</p> <p>If you are eligible and receive a code from HMRC (using the link above), please send it to us so that we can apply for the funding on your behalf.</p>
4	Is my child (aged 3-4) eligible for 15 hours free childcare?	The '15 hours free childcare' early years funding is a universal entitlement for pupils aged three and four in the Nursery Years and KG in the Pre-Prep and Girls' schools. The entitlement is available to pupils after the term in which they turn three until the term in which they turn five. The Local Authority's (Wandsworth Council) term dates are used in this scenario rather than the actual term dates of Eaton House Schools. The funding is automatically applied to your school fees invoice as the school applies for the funding on parents' behalf. In order to apply for the funding, we require parents to fill out and return the Nursery Grant Parent Declaration form before the submission deadline. NOTE: A new form must be submitted each term, regardless of any prior terms submissions.
5	Is my child (aged 3-4) eligible for 30 hours free childcare?	<p>An additional 15 hours free childcare is available to working parents. 6	Why does the 15 hours free childcare line on my invoice show a zero amount?	As the Nursery Grant is not a discount but a deduction granted by the council, this figure is shown as £0. However, please be advised that the grant has been deducted from the fees total for the relevant term for which we are invoicing.
7	What is the additional services line on my invoice?	To continue from question 6, as there is a deduction from the fees due to the nursery grant, we present the remaining payable balance as 'additional services' and not 'term fees.'
8	We haven't signed up for clubs for next term yet, why have we been billed?	School fees are invoiced in advance and termly extras such as after-school clubs are invoiced in arrears.
9	When are the school fees due?	The school fees are always due on or before the first day of term and the due date can be found on the invoice. The direct debit collection for school fees goes out on the first day of term.
10	Can childcare vouchers be used to pay for school fees?	Yes, but only until the term in which they turn five. After this point, childcare vouchers can only be used to pay for childcare outside of school hours and term time i.e. after-school clubs, Vesper club and holiday camp.
11	Can HMRC's Tax-Free Childcare payments be used to pay for school fees?	Yes, but only until the term in which they turn five. After this point, TFC payments can only be used to pay for childcare outside of school hours and term time i.e. after-school clubs, Vesper club and holiday camp.
